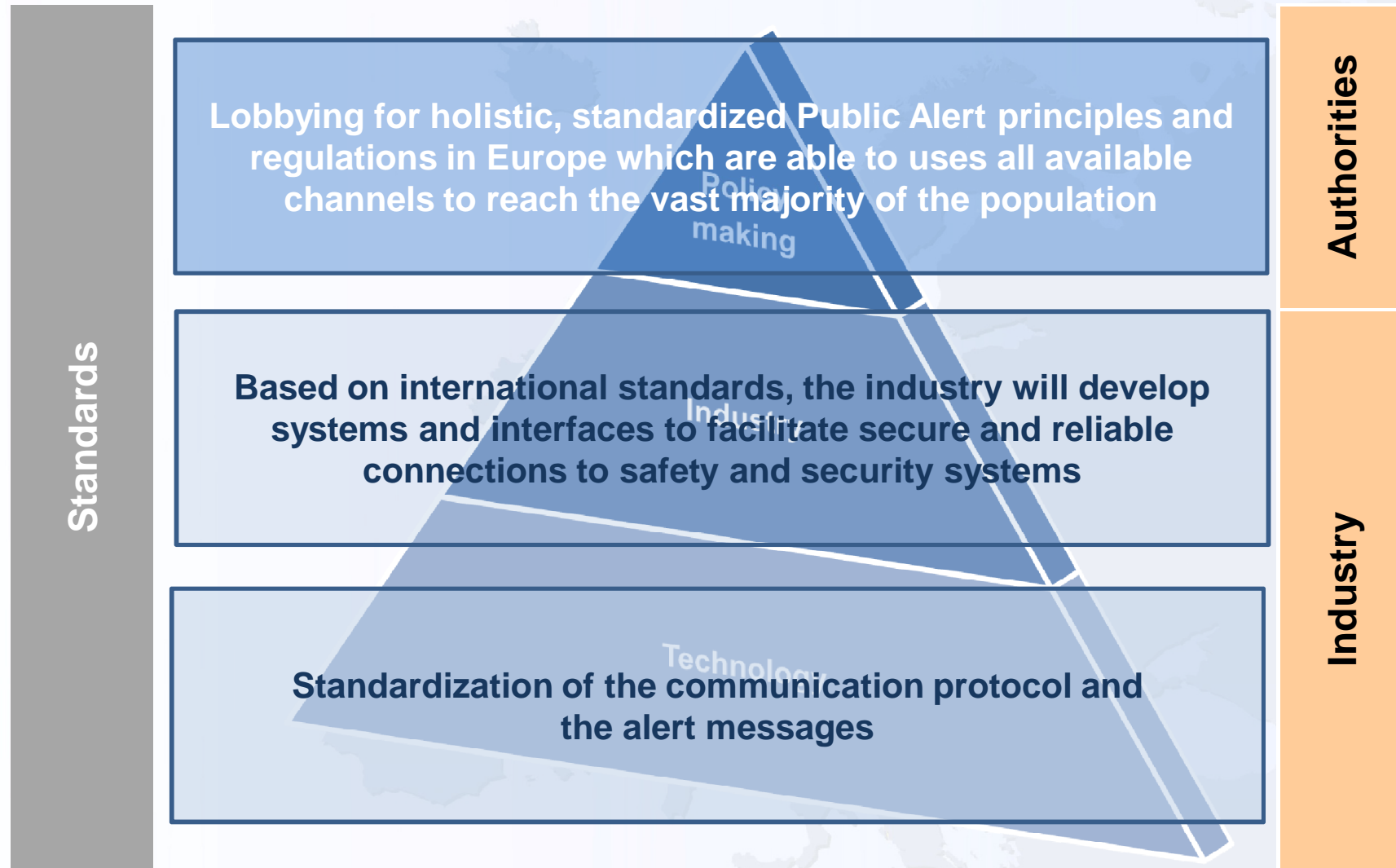


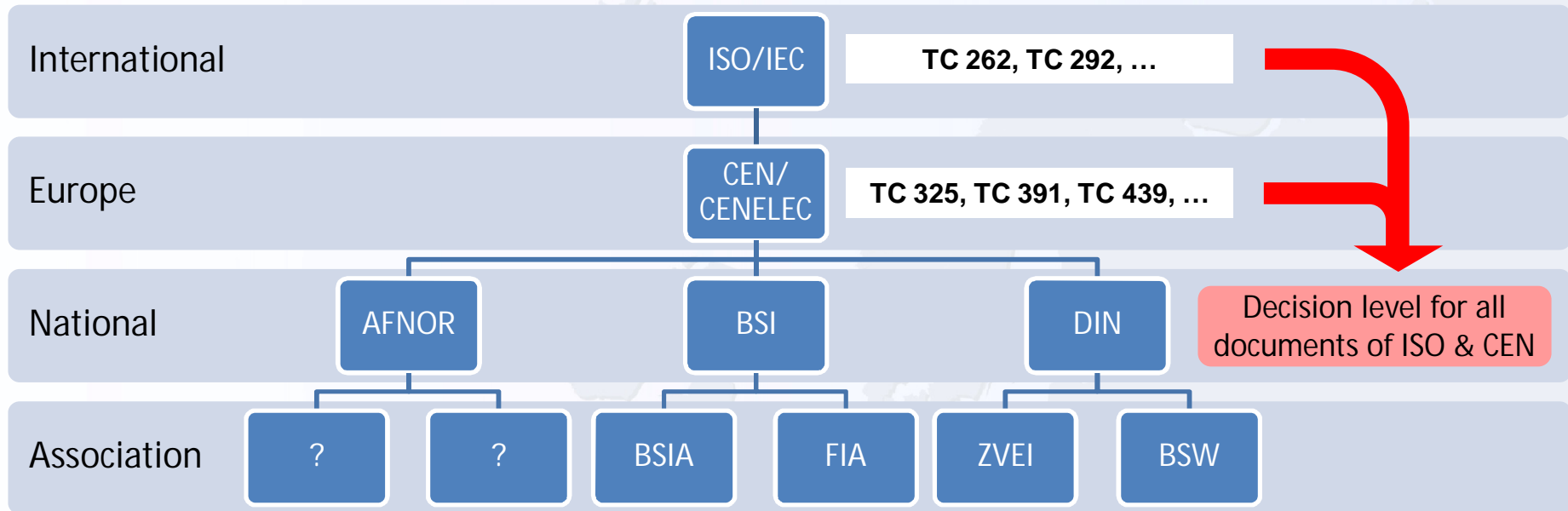


Where Standards can help?

Expert driven model

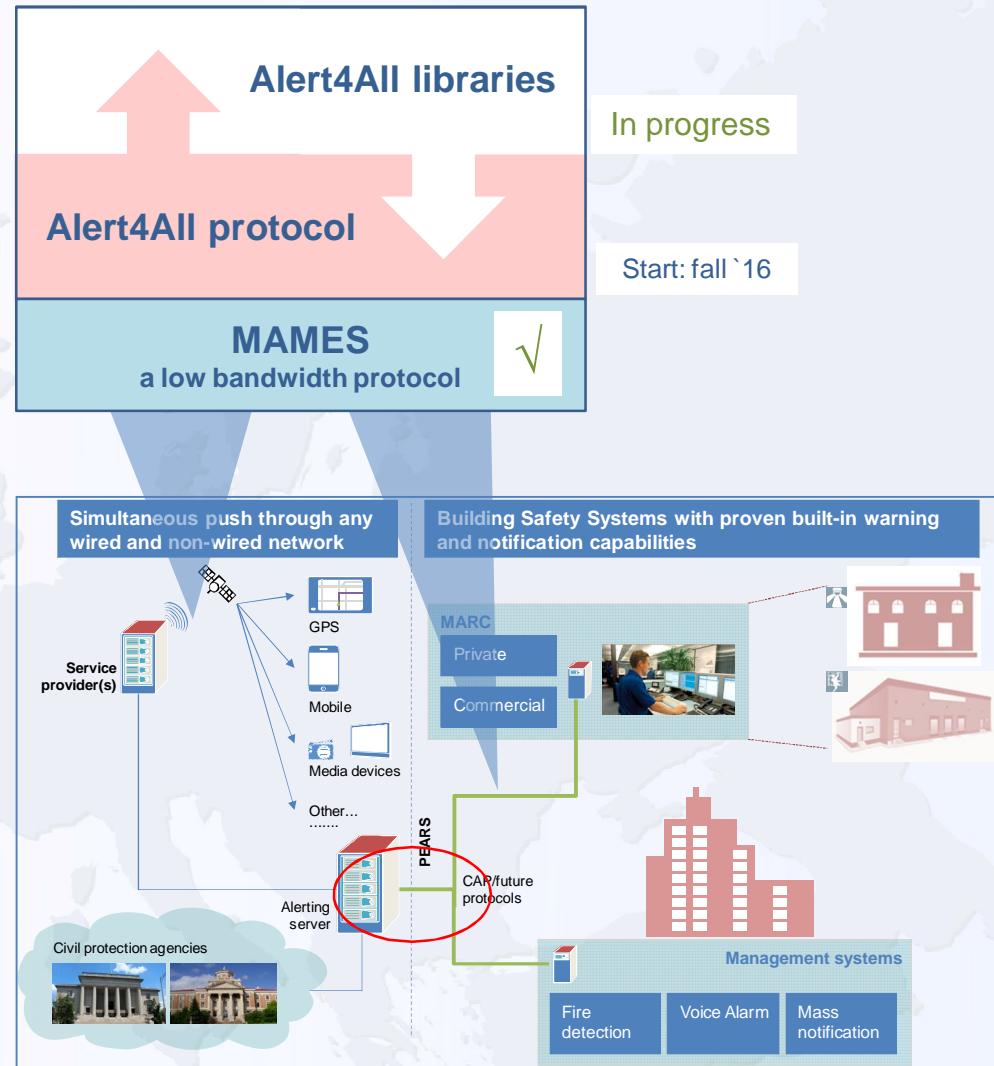


- Everybody can initiate a new standardization project via its local organization, as long she/he is member of a national committee or has got a liaison with a technical committee
- If a proposal finds enough support the real work starts and runs according clear as well as transparent rules within ISO/IEC or CEN/CENELEC

Results for the protocol level



- MAMES, suitable for satellite links, was a low hanging fruit of ETSI
- ETSI also supports the current work on the Alert4All libraries and the future work on the Alert4All protocol
- Next step is to market these efforts and to extend the stakeholder network
